Close ties to legal and business practice, combined with an interdisciplinary profile in the economic sciences, are hallmarks of the Department of Law.

As part of the research activities conducted at the Department of Law, a close cooperation with other faculties and departments of Mannheim University as well as with numerous German and international universities and institutes takes place. The majority of research activities is concentrated in various institutes.

- Consecutive 2 year programme (only open for alumni of the Mannheim LL.B. Programme)

Master of Comparative Business Law (M.C.B.L.)

- 1st Semester at the University of Mannheim &
2nd Semester at the university of Adelaide, Australia
(or two semesters at the University of Mannheim)
- Language of Instruction: English (no German required)
- 1 year programme

Master of Competition Law and Regulation

- Indepth education in competition law and regulation
- Two main tracks: energy economy and digital economy
- Language of Instruction: German and English
- 2-year programme

Mannheim is also part of the **CIEL** (European Master in Comparative International and European Law) network with the Universities of Antwerpen, Maastricht, Pompeu Fabra Barcelona, Toulouse 1 Capitole, Dublin and Zagreb.

We also offer a Double-Degree respectively Certificate in Business Law in cooperation with Toulouse 1 Capitole.

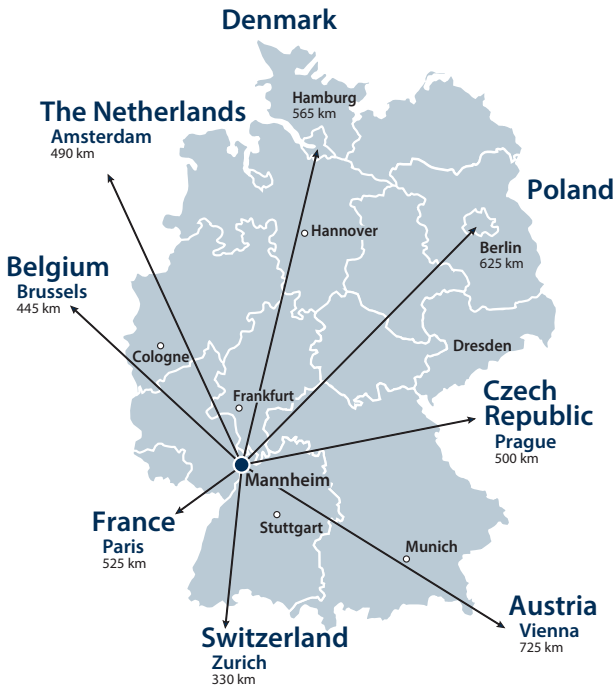
What Mannheim has to offer

- Founded in 1907, there are about 12,000 students studying at the University of Mannheim. About 1,100 incoming exchange students from 100 countries and 450 partner universities are coming to Mannheim each year.

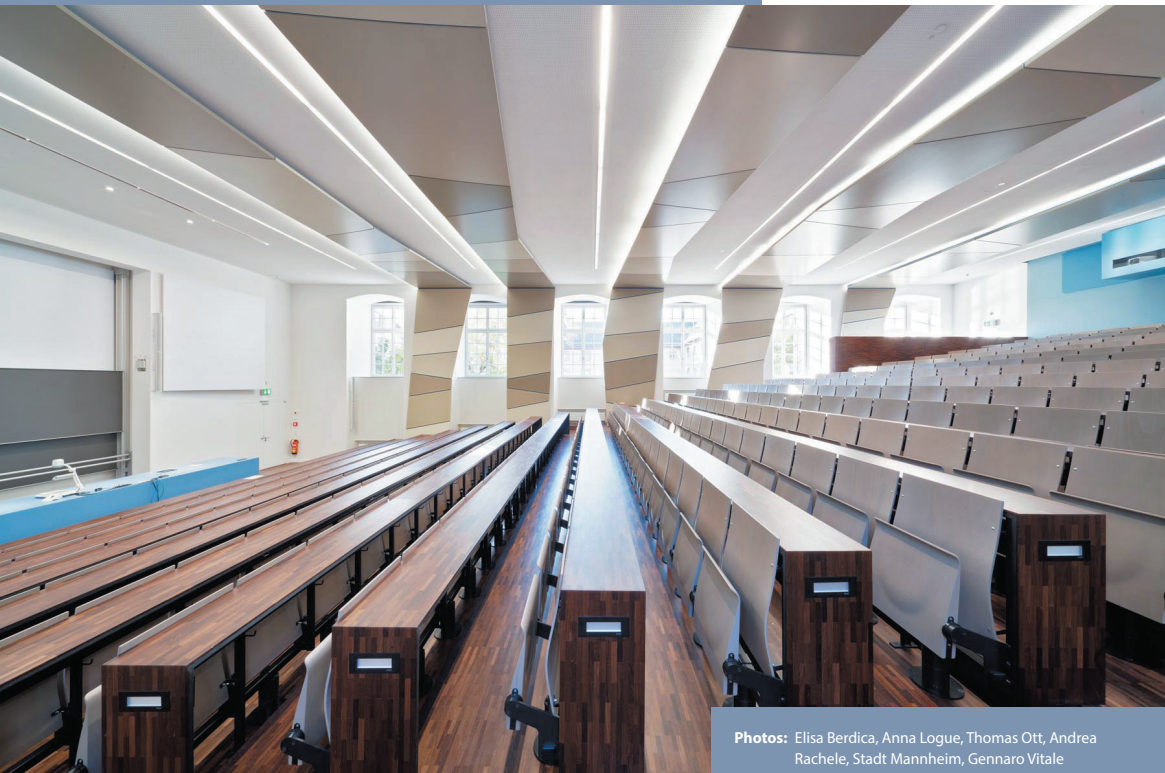
